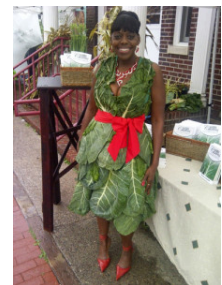
Keynote Speaker: Ms. Susan Burton **Founder and Director of a New Way of Life Reentry Project**



In 1998 Ms. Susan Burton founded a New Way of Life Reentry Project. Since then she has dedicated her life to helping others break the cycle of incarceration. Her message in *From Prison to Recovery*, as well as her grassroots effort, is similar to JPC's vision: a society with true justice and equality for all, with institutions based on reconciliation and restoration, instead of retribution and violence. Susan has earned numerous awards and honors for her work. In 2010, she was named a *CNN Top Ten Hero* and received the prestigious *Citizen Activist Award* from the *Harvard Kennedy School of Government*. She is a recipient of both the *Encore Purpose Prize* (2012) and the *James Irvine Foundation Leadership Award* (2014). In 2015, on the 50th Anniversary of Selma and the Voting Rights Act, Susan Burton was named by the *Los Angeles Times* as one of eighteen New Civil Rights Leaders in the nation. Released in 2017, her memoir, *Becoming Ms. Burton* received a 2018 NAACP Image Award for Outstanding Literary Work in the category of Biography/Autobiography. *Becoming Ms. Burton* is also the recipient of the inaugural Goddard Riverside Stephan Russo Book Prize for Social Justice.

Theresa Lou Bowick, also known as "Nurse Bowick" in Rochester New York, where she hosts the popular radio show, "Health Beats" on WDKX 103.9 FM, wears a dress made of real collard greens to promote her first book, *Collard Green Curves*-a fat girl's journey from childhood obesity to healthy living. The self-published memoir provides insight on the many factors beyond poor food choices and lack of exercise that contribute to childhood obesity, such as poverty, blended families, domestic violence, educational and religious institutions. In 2017, *Collard Green Curves* debuted as a stage play to a sold-out crowd at Geva Theatre.
